
# When Water Makes Mud: A Story of Refugee Children

#### **Craft Stick Doll**


**Supplies**: Craft stick, yarn, fabric, buttons, ribbon, sharpies, markers, pipe cleaners, glue, stickers— you decide.

- 1. Use markers and color or ... glue fabric.
- 2. Or cut a length of yarn. Glue end to bottom of stick. Wrap yarn around stick. Glue in place.
- 3. Leave space for face and hair.



## **No Sew Cloth Doll**

**Supplies:** 12x12 piece of plain cloth (for body), cotton ball, rubber band, scissors, 3x6 piece of printed fabric (for apron), 6x6 piece of printed fabric (for scarf).



1.Cut 1 " slits for apron ties.

2. Place cotton ball in center of 12" x 12" square. Fold fabric diagonally and secure with rubber band.


Tie a knot in each arm.



3. Tie on apron. Tie scarf under doll's chin.

### No Sew Sock Doll

Supplies: One sock, cotton stuffing, 4 regular rubber bands (or tiny clear hair bands), Sharpies/markers.




1. Stuff your sock to here leaving a few inches unstuffed at top.

2. Wrap rubber bands at head, neck, and arms.

3. Fold sock top down for hat and flip brim





# **Paper Doll Chain**

**Supplies:** Scissors, tape, paper, crayons, markers, glitter, stickers, wrapping paper—you decide.




- 1. Fold computer paper length wise. Cut in half to make a paper strip.
- 2. Fold strip in half—in half again—accordion style.



3. Fold in half one more time.

Folded edge

4. Draw half a doll on the folded edge of the paper. The hands and feet must touch the right side of the paper, or the chain will fall apart. Trace half of a quarter for the size of the head. Cut around doll shape. Decorate. Try making different sizes.
